Yardage:

Fabric A:	3/4 yard of 10097-2
Fabric B:	3/4 yard of 10095-1
Fabric C:	3/4 yard of 10093-4
Fabric D:	1/2 yard of 10092-3
Fabric E:	1 Panel of 10090
Inner Border:	1/2 yard of 10098-2
Outer Border:	1 yard 10091-1
Binding:	1/2 yard of 10094-2
Backing:	3 yards of 10096-2
Fusible Web:	1 yard

Cutting:

Fabric A:	Cut nine 8-1/2" squares.
Fabric B:	Cut seventy-two 2-1/2" x 4-1/2" strips.
Fabric C:	Cut (144) 2-1/2" squares.
Fabric D:	Fussy cut thirty-six 2-1/2" squares, centering a pumpkin.
Fabric E:	Following the manufacturer's instructions, back the panel with fusible web, Fussy cut nine different pictures for the centers.
Inner Border:	Cut two 2-1/2" x 36-1/2" and two 2-1/2" x 40-1/2" strips.
Outer Border:	Cut two 4-1/2" x 36-1/2" and two 2-1/2" x 40-1/2" strips. Cut three 4-1/2" x width of fabric (WOF) strips. Piece them together into two 4-1/2" x 48-1/2" strips.
Binding:	Cut five 2-1/4" x WOF strips. Piece them together for binding.
Backing:	Piece the fabric into one 54" square for backing.

Directions:

- 1) Place one 2-1/2" Fabric C square on the top left side of one 2-1/2" x 4-1/2" Fabric B rectangle, right sides together (Fig. 1). Mark and sew across the diagonal from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 1). Open out the triangle formed and finger press the seam open (Fig. 2). Check that the corners are aligned squarely. Flip the triangle back down and trim away the excess fabric approximately 1/4" for the seam allowance.
- 2) Place another 2-1/2" Fabric C square on the top right side of the 2-1/2" x 4-1/2" Fabric B rectangle, right sides together (Fig. 3). Mark and sew across the diagonal from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 3). Open out the triangle formed and finger press the seam open (Fig. 4). Check that the corners are aligned squarely. Flip the triangle back down and trim away the excess fabric approximately 1/4" for the seam allowance.
- 3) Repeat steps 1 and 2 to make seventy-two flying geese units.
- 4) Follow the Block Layout and assemble nine blocks.
- 5) Following the manufacturer's instructions, fuse one Fabric E picture to the center of each block.
- 6) Finish the raw edges with a decorative stitch such as a buttonhole or satin stitch.
- 7) Lay out the quilt blocks into three rows of three blocks each. Once you have the pictures arranged to your liking, sew the blocks together to make the quilt top.
- 8) Sew one 2-1/2" x 36-1/2" Inner Border to each side of the quilt top. Sew one 2-1/2" x 40-1/2" Inner Border to the top and bottom of the quilt top.
- 9) Sew one 4-1/2" x 40-1/2" Outer Border to the sides of the quilt top. Sew one 4-1/2" x 48-1/2" Outer Border to the top and bottom of the quilt top.
- 10) Layer, quilt and bind as desired.

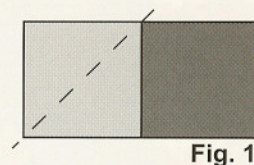

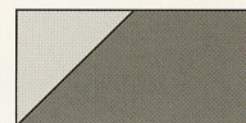

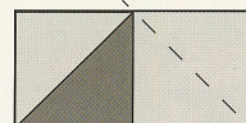

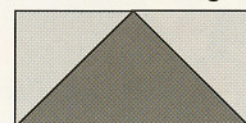
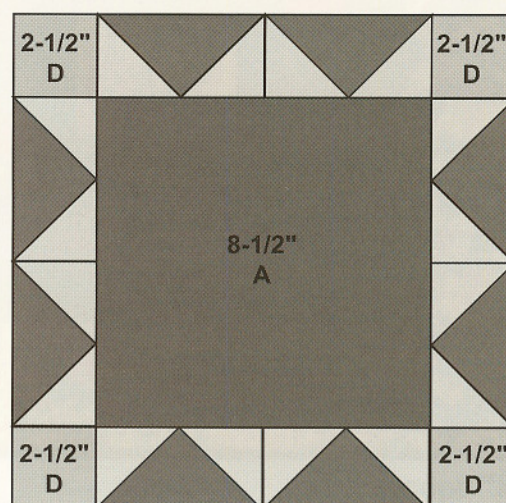
