Materials

Yardages based on 42" wide fabric.

- ¼ Yard or length of one Panel (24050-1)
- 2 Yards - Stripe (24051-1)
- ¼ Yard - White Tree Toss (24052-1)
- ¼ Yard - Green Holly (24053-5)
- ½ Yard - Red Plaid (24054-2)
- ¼ Yard - White Stars (24055-1)
- ½ Yard - Red Stars (24055-2)
- ¼ Yard - Green Stars (24055-5)
- 3 Yards backing of your choice

Cut the Fabrics

WOF = Width of Fabric

LOF = Length of Fabric

From the Panel cut:

- 1 – Trim leaving at least ¼" seam allowance outside the panel images

From the Stripe fussy cut:

- 4 – 5" x 36" LOF strips

From the White Tree Toss cut:

- 4 – 8½" x 9" rectangles
- 4 – 8½" x 16" rectangles

From the Green Holly cut:

- 24 – 2½" x 6½" rectangles
- 12 – 3½" x 6½" rectangles

From the Red Plaid cut:

- 6 – 2½" x WOF (binding)

From the White Stars cut:

- 2 – 3" x WOF
- 48 – 2½" squares
- 24 – 3½" x 3½" squares

From the Red Stars cut:

- 4 – 2½" x WOF

From the Green Stars cut:

- 4 – 1½" x 33½" strips
- 1 – 1½" x WOF

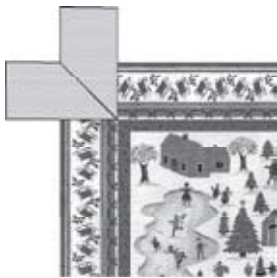

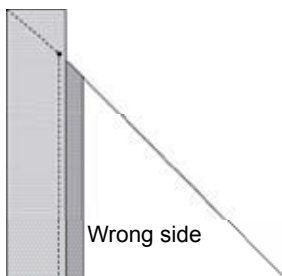

Directions

Tree Blocks: 6½" x 8½"

1. Create a strips set by sewing a 3" x WOF White Stars strip to each side of a 1½" x WOF Green Stars strip and press the seams toward the green stars. Cut this strip set into twelve 1½" trunk sections. Figure 1
2. Place a 2½" White Star square on the corner of a 2½" x 6½" Green Holly rectangle. Sew across the White Star square diagonally and trim to within ¼" of the seam and press. Repeat on the other side. Repeat for a total of twenty-four middle tree sections. Figure 2
3. Place a 3½" x 3½" White Star square on the corner of a 3½" x 6½" Green Holly rectangle. Sew across the White Star square diagonally and trim to within ¼" of the seam and press. Repeat on the other side. Repeat for a total of twelve tree top sections.
4. To complete the tree blocks sew one tree top section, two middle tree sections and one trunk section together as shown. Repeat for a total of twelve tree blocks. Figure 3

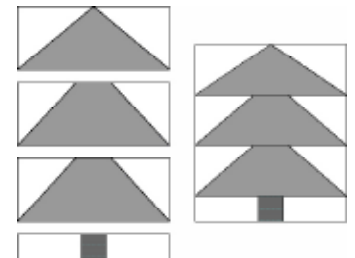

Putting it Together

1. Sew a 2½" x WOF Red Star strip to the right and left edges of the panel. Trim the excess fabric from the strip where it extends past the top and bottom of the panel and press. Sew a 2½" x WOF Red Star strip to the top and bottom edges of the panel. Trim the excess fabric from the strip where it extends past the left and right edges and press. Trim this completed panel section and borders to measure 22½" x 24½".
2. Center and pin a stripe border strip in place. Sew the seam by starting and ending ¼" from raw edge, backstitch to secure and press seam toward the quilt top. Repeat on the remaining three edges. Figure 4
3. Lay quilt top right side up on your ironing board and fold each border end flat back onto itself, right sides together, forming a 45 degree angle at the quilt's corner. Press to form a crease. Figure 5
4. Fold the quilt with right sides together. Line up border strip raw edges, border seams at the ¼" backstitched point, and pressed creases and pin in place. Stitch along the crease, backstitching at ¼" border seam. Repeat on the remaining three corners. Figure 6
5. Press seam open. With quilt right side up, align 45 degree angle line of a square ruler on seam line to check accuracy. If corner is flat and square, trim excess fabric to ¼" seam allowance.
6. Sew a 1½" x 33½" Green Star strip to the right and left sides of the quilt top and press the seams away from the center of the quilt. Sew a 1½" x 33½" Green Star strip to the top and bottom of the quilt top and press the seams away from the center.
7. Sew three of the Tree Blocks together to form a strip. Repeat for a total of four tree strips.
8. Sew a 8½" x 9" strip to each end of a tree strip completed in step 4. Repeat for a total of two. Sew these tree borders strips to the right and left sides of the quilt and press.
9. Sew the remaining White Tree Toss rectangles to each end of the remaining two tree strips. Sew these tree borders to the top and bottom of the quilt top and press.
10. Layer the quilt top, batting and backing and quilt as desired. Add binding to the quilt.
